The beautiful lavender-hued Iris laevigata, or rabbit-ear Iris, is the official flower of the city of Kariya, Japan—Mississauga's sister city after which the park is named.

Civic Centre 300 City Centre Drive

The award-winning postmodern architecture of the Mississauga Civic Centre, opened in 1987, includes design elements that pay tribute to the area's agricultural past: the main building represents a farmhouse, the Council Chamber represents a grain silo, and the clock tower a windmill.



Absolute World aka the "Marilyn Monroe Towers"

60 Absolute Avenue

Meet Marilyn: one of two Absolute World Condos soaring 56 and 50 storeys high; the tallest earned its nickname due to the design's curvaceous hourglass figure. The buildings were completed in 2012. The unique 209-degree twist from the base to the top provides residents with unobstructed views of the city and beyond.



Port Credit Lighthouse

105 Lakeshore Road East

See a panoramic view of the Credit River, harbour, and the village of Port Credit from the deck of this iconic red and white lighthouse. Home to the Port Credit Business Association, the structure is also a true beacon to sailors—visible from up to 15 miles on Lake Ontario.
