
## **Guest Editor's Note**



Hans Jongman was born in The Hague, Netherlands in 1950. His poems were first published in 1971 in the Dutch Language. In 1980 he self-published a collection of lyric poems in Dutch, which included a chapter of haiku and tanka. In 1986, Hans joined Haiku Canada and was its membership-secretary for twelve years. His haiku have been featured on CIUT-FM in Toronto, and in 1996 he was the winner of the "20,000 Poets Under the League Poetry Slam." That reading has been posted on Youtube under the aka "Dutch Jongman." He remains an active member of Haiku Canada and the Haiku Society of America.
